

RELATIONS WITH COMMUNITY AND BUSINESS ORGANIZATIONS

The Board of Education believes that the public schools have the primary responsibility for the formal education of the children and youth of the community. However, the Board recognizes that many community organizations, while not primarily concerned with education, play a definite role in education.

Therefore, it is the policy of the Board of Education to support, to the extent permitted by law and consistent with its educational mission, local organizations whose efforts will result in improved educational opportunities for the students of the school district.

Board members shall seek to maintain regular interaction with community and business leadership, both on a formal and informal basis. The Superintendent of Schools and Building Principals are encouraged to develop plans to cooperate with and involve community and business groups in appropriate activities.
