ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Introduction

The Board of Education (“Board”) recognizes its responsibility to enact policy that clearly delineates between resident and non-resident student status and the implications this status has on admission to the Hewlett-Woodmere Public Schools.

Definition

For the purpose of attendance in the district schools, a resident is defined as an individual whose domicile is within the School District.

Eligibility for Admission

Non-resident pupils are denied the privilege of attending the School District schools except in the following circumstances:

1. Eligibility of Former Residents

- A resident student who moves out of the School District after April 1st may be allowed to complete the school year in the school in which they started the school year, without the payment of tuition, at the School District’s sole discretion.
- Students enrolled in Grade 11 who move out of the District after April 1st may be permitted to finish their senior year in the high school and graduate with their class, upon the payment of tuition, at the School District’s sole discretion.

2. Eligibility of Special Non-Residents Under Contract From Other Districts

Non-resident students who apply for entry into special classes (e.g. Alternative Learning Program or programs for handicapped pupils) may, in the sole discretion of the Board of Education, be accepted, on an annual basis, pursuant to annual contracts with their home district, if they can be suitably placed without prejudice to the School District or School District students. Non-resident enrollment will be reviewed annually.

3. Eligibility for Non-Resident Students Awaiting Possession of Home in District

Non-residents who are scheduled by contract to take title and possession to a residence, or by lease to take possession of a residence in the School District up to sixty (60) calendar days following the first school day each student is eligible to attend school following enrollment of their child(ren)

(“non-resident applicants”), may register their children prior to establishing such residency upon delivering to the School District’s Registrar:

A. A check or money order made payable to the Hewlett-Woodmere U.F.S.D. in an amount equal to the per diem amount of tuition for the number of days school is in session during the sixty (60) calendar days following enrollment of their child(ren) for non-resident students. The proceeds of the check shall be held by the School District until delivery to the Registrar of:

- the closing statement showing delivery of title and possession to the non-resident applicant; or a verified statement from the landlord attesting to the non-resident’s applicant’s possession of the apartment; or a letter from an attorney affirming possession; or such other evidence satisfactory to the Registrar that the non-resident applicants actually commenced residence in the School District. Such evidence may include, but not limited to, utility bills, movers’ bills, sworn affidavits from the nonresident applicants or witnesses and home visits by School District representatives. If actual residence in the School District is established within the sixty (60) days, the proceeds of the check will be returned. If actual residence in the School District is not established within sixty (60) days, the proceeds of the check will be retained by the School District and the non-resident applicant’s child or children will be disenrolled from attendance.

B. A sworn affidavit, acknowledging the non-resident applicant’s status as a non-resident, and that such status shall continue unless and until the non-resident applicant has actually established residence in the School District.

4. Upon recommendation of the principal, any non-resident student may be denied enrollment in or removed from School District schools if the student has failed or fails to comply with (a) the School District’s requirements for maintaining good academic standing, (b) the School District’s attendance policy, or (c) the School District’s Code of Conduct.

5. The parent(s)/guardian(s) of the non-resident student are responsible for transporting the non-resident student to and from school until the time that they become bona fide residents.

Exclusion of Students

Nothing in the preceding paragraphs shall prevent the exclusion of non-resident students when such exclusion is deemed to be in the interests of the schools and community.

FEES

Non-resident students will pay tuition at the rate set forth in the Commissioner's Regulations as follows:

- Tuition shall be payable annually. If student does not attend for a full semester, the tuition will be prorated by weeks of attendance (partial weeks are considered a full week).

Any student who is not a resident of the School District or has not been properly admitted pursuant to this policy shall be removed from attendance in the schools of the School District and may be subject to the payment of tuition.

Reservation of Rights

The School District reserves the right to refuse to admit a non-resident student if the Superintendent of Schools or her/his designee determines that:

- placement in the School District's program would result in the exclusion of a resident student;
- the admission of the non-resident student will result in an increase in the size of the faculty or staff necessary to educate the non-resident student;
- the student has been disciplined, suspended or excluded from her/his previous school for disruptive behavior or endangering the health and safety of other students.

PARTICIPATION IN SPECIAL EXTENSIONS OF THE INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM**Adult Education**

Non-residents may be accepted in Adult Education classes provided:

1. Residents are given priority in selective classes, as noted in the brochure,
2. The non-residents satisfy any prerequisite for courses in which they wish to enroll respecting their ability and training,
3. No increase in the size of the faculty or staff will be necessary to accommodate them
4. Their presence will not result in classes containing more than the desired number of participants, and
5. For those classes run in cooperation with another district, residents of both districts are given priority placement.

Registration fees for non-residents shall be in accordance with the annual Adult Education Fee List as provided by the Board of Education.

**SUMMER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM, SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM
AND RECREATION BUILDING YOUTH PROGRAM**

Only those non-residents who are in continuous attendance in the district public schools shall be accepted into the Summer Educational Program, the Summer Recreation Program or the Recreation Building Youth Program, except as otherwise authorized by the Superintendent of Schools. On a space available basis, children of district employees may enroll in programs and pay the appropriate fees.

REVIEW OF POLICY

The Superintendent of Schools shall periodically review the operation of this policy.
