PUBLIC COMPLAINTS REGARDING INSTRUCTION

The Superintendent shall recommend and the Board of Education shall adopt rules which provide for the proper procedures for the orderly consideration of public complaints.

PUBLIC COMPLAINTS REGARDING INSTRUCTION: INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

1. Complaints about any instructional materials are to be made as follows:
 - a. They must be submitted in writing on the forms provided for this purpose by the Hewlett-Woodmere Public Schools or in a signed statement containing the following information:
 - 1) title, author, publisher, copyright date and page(s) on which the alleged unsuitable material appears
 - 2) quotations of the alleged unsuitable material with a clear statement of the writer's objections to the material
 - 3) name and address of the complainant if acting as an individual
 - 4) if complaint is made by an organization, the name and address of the individual complainant and of the organization he/she represents and a statement of the complainant's position in the organization.
 - b. They must be sent to the Superintendent of Schools who will forward them to the Board of Education.
2. If any complaint is filed which involves allegedly seditious or disloyal matter, it shall be handled in accordance with Section 704 of the Education Law. Three copies of the complaint forms will be prepared and sent to the Textbook Commission, State Education Department, Albany, New York.
3. An investigation of the merit of any complaint shall be made only at the request of the Board of Education.
4. Upon request of the Board of Education, the Superintendent of Schools shall appoint a Special Review Committee. Such committee shall include representation from the grade level subject area and/or department involved.
5. After due deliberation this Special Review Committee shall submit a report of its findings to the Board of Education through the Superintendent of Schools. The report needs not to be unanimous. It may be composed of separate majority and minority reports.
6. The Board of Education shall make a final decision concerning the merit of the complaint based upon:
 - a. the report of the Special Review Committee
 - b. the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and
 - c. any other additional data it may consider necessary.
