HIGH SCHOOL INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM DIPLOMA

The Board of Education and staff of the Hewlett-Woodmere Public Schools will enable each student with a handicapping condition every opportunity to earn a Regents and/or Hewlett High School Diploma. The Board of Education will, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, award a high school Individualized Education Program Diploma to students with handicapping conditions as follows:

A student with a handicapping condition who has attained the age of twenty-one and has achieved the educational goals of his/her Individualized Education Program.

A student who has attended school, or received a substantially equivalent education elsewhere, for twelve years exclusive of Kindergarten, if the goals of the students' Individualized Education Program have been met.

A student who is awarded an Individualized Education Program diploma who is less than twenty-one years of age, will receive written assurance of his/her continued right to attend school until the end of the school year in which he/she reaches the age twenty-one or earn a Regents and/or Hewlett High School Diploma.
